


### New Villagers Club of Tellico Village News & Events

**IMPORTANT NOTICE:** At our September 8<sup>th</sup> meeting, the NV Board of Directors decided to cap the COVID-related membership extensions at 6 months. So, if you registered as a New Villager on or after 1 September 2020, you will be back on the usual 2-year membership schedule. Anyone who was registered as a New Villager prior to that date will receive a 6-month extension to compensate for the 6 months (March-August) during which we were COVID-limited. You do not need to do anything to receive this extension. Your graduation date will be automatically extended and you will be notified of your graduation from New Villagers accordingly. So, if you would normally have graduated at the end of June 2020, then your new graduation date will be December 31 of 2020. In the meantime, make it a point to enjoy all that New Villagers has to offer!

<u>Smoky Mountain Service Dogs</u> - Are you a "new" Tennessean who loves dogs, wants to support disabled veterans and would like to sport an inspiring specialty license plate on your vehicle? Then, Smoky Mountain Service Dogs needs your help to meet its goal of pre-selling 1,000 specialty plates this year. Smoky Mountain Service Dogs (SMSD), located in Lenoir City, trains mobility assistance service dogs for Military Veterans with service-connected physical and psychological disabilities. SMSD has helped 35 disabled veterans receive their service dog at no cost to them. As new



Another December activity is our New Villager Holiday Soiree: An Evening of Food, Friendship, and Song being held at the Yacht Club on Saturday, December 12th. The Knoxville Opera singers will put on a program of holiday songs (in English) as we are not allowed to hold dances at this time due to Covid-19, per the POA. 

We live in the Chatuga Neighborhood


We are from Allegany, NY which is about 60 miles south of Buffalo, NY.




Toni & Steve McCormick
